Back in January I asked prayer for Pastor Thelamour's granddaughter Fayita. This six-year-old had been hit by a car as she was walking to school in Port-au-Prince. The report was that flesh and bones were exposed. The first picture is after the two surgeries she had in four days. The second picture is after the skin grafting in March, which in God's timing happened the week before the medical workers went on strike. The initial report was that it would be two years before she was healed and mobile. Less than three weeks after the grafts, she was walking and did not require a brace. She has already returned to school. The family is rejoicing in answered prayer.





Crime continues in Haiti. Two weeks ago, a pastor in St. Raphael was kidnapped. One pastor in that area told me that they are afraid to go to sleep at night because of armed break-ins. I have heard the same comment from people living in Cap Haitien. It does not seem to matter whether it is a big city or small, populous or rural, crime has spread everywhere in Haiti. Haitians are frustrated and angry over continuing insecurity, delayed elections and constantly increasing costs. That anger been behind demonstrations and more destruction as people vent their feelings. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will guide Christians and convict sinners.
