

Livingston 8-27-2025 Brief update

This will be a brief update. I will be having an outpatient procedure on my upper eyelids this afternoon. Those have been getting saggy and baggy, especially the right one, for more than a year, and it is time to do something. It will be nice not to feel like a curtain is falling when I read.

The news from Haiti has been quiet recently, but that does not mean the gang activity has ceased. An indication of continuing trouble was the requirement to install razor wire on the walls around the clinic property. That work was completed in early August.

The major challenge for many families right now is getting their kids registered for school. There has been a lot of scrambling to find the money for tuition and open spots for students. The north has had a big influx of families fleeing the areas under attack further south, and that has created competition for places in schools. After all that work by families to be ready for September 4, the government announced last week that it is moving the official opening date to October 4.

Haitian Christians are struggling like everyone else, but their trust in God has remained firm. I hear that from former staff workers as they deal with family and health problems. Their government has failed, but they know that God rules all things and they are safe in His care.

We all need clear vision, able to see Who God is, to see our constant need of redemption in Jesus Christ, and constantly see truth in His Word. May we all be "looking unto Jesus."
