Nor was the day last week that was put on hold for dilated pupils that took longer than expected to return to normal (ten hours instead of four!). My astigmatism is severe enough that I will have to pay a small extra fee for the new lens. My new glasses will be ready next week—and the exam is this Saturday.

God has been in control of all of this, and I have seen these events as opportunities for Him to be glorified. I am grateful that I have been able to drive and read and study. There has been some eye fatigue, but not like last year. Thanks to a supporting ladies' group providing an extra day in a hotel, I was able to finish the study materials the first time in early November. I hope to finish the second review today or tomorrow.

Thanks for praying as I take the exam on Saturday morning. To be able to see the computer screen for that test is a blessing from our Father.
