Dear Praying Friends:

The clinic staff and I were reading in Revelation during September. Our response to this passage was, "Amen" and "Praise God!" We did not have a prime minister at that time, and there were many rumors about what was happening in the government and with the funds coming into the country. We were reminded that a day is coming when the earth will be ruled in justice and righteousness because the living Word of God will be the ruler.

The clinic was busy during the past three months. There were 340 new patients, as well as 1140 return visits. A new area was created for us on the campus of Maranatha Baptist Church. We moved there in early September. The staff has more room to work, and the patients can sit indoors when it rains. Many of them still like to sit outside, but that may be because they no longer have to keep an eye out for falling palm branches and coconuts, or for ants dropping from the mango trees.

After many delays, the legal work for my property is complete, and the deed is registered. In July, I asked the American who had given the original estimate for the cost of the wall to check his numbers again. It turned out that his estimate was for the planned clinic portion, but it did not include the land to be used for housing. That will more than double his original cost of US \$40,000. God knew about this difference, and I think He put it on my heart to check the costs again.

Praise Hurricane Irene affected our area, but there was no damage.

The Bowers had meetings in two areas recently and saw people saved in both places. The Pearts returned to their home and ministry in Haiti in mid-September.

Projects My truck in Haiti (2003 Toyota Hilux) is getting old. It has given good service for more than 8 years. We have done maintenance and replaced parts, but now the frame is showing the strain of thousands of miles over bad roads. It would be great if we could get a diesel engine, manual transmission, 4WD, double-cab pickup truck. Toyota or Mitsubishi might be better since the parts are readily available. I was surprised when I went online to discover that it will probably not be possible to purchase such a truck in the US. I would appreciate suggestions, as well as your prayers about this matter.

Prayer I will be driving several thousand miles during the next two months. Please pray for my safety, and that I will have adequate time for rest.

Please pray for the clinic staff as they take care of our routine return-visit patients.

This past year many people have displayed their dissatisfaction with their government leaders and deposed some of them. Even our best leaders are flawed, and their plans often fail. Some day that will change, and we will rejoice as our Lord reigns in truth and righteousness. Even so, come, Lord Jesus!
