2015 January 18 Back in Haiti!

Greetings from Wallondri (also spelled Wallondry)!

Last Sunday evening I was getting ready to pack a vehicle and drive from Greenville SC to Ft. Pierce FL. The prediction was for occasional showers, but instead there were torrential rains and lightning. [My sister says weather forecasters make astrology and fortune telling look respectable.] I was grateful to God for the upgrade to a heavier rental vehicle as I drove through the night in the rain on some very wet roads.

The vehicle was unloaded on Monday morning at Missionary Flights International (MFI). I was able to make several purchases before turning in the rental car and going to get some rest. The first part of the trip to Cap Haitien Tuesday morning was bumpy (sort of like our rural Haitian roads). We went through the back part of the storm I have driven through Sunday night! We made it through customs at the airport without problems, and then traveled to Wallondri.

Wednesday morning I took pictures of the Ministry Residence. As the men promised, the building is beautiful and solid. They did excellent work. We are grateful to God for the very generous gift from a supporting church that made the rough and smooth plastering possible. Isaac and I spent time going over what still needs to be done, as well writing lists of jobs and materials.

Thursday morning it was back to Cap Haitien to check on prices and materials. We now have a Sherwin Williams paint store and options for primer, wall paint and floor sealant. Those of you who have been to Cap will understand my surprise at seeing the coast line along the road from the airport to the police station. The businesses and buildings I have known for years are all gone, removed in the name of tourism.

It has taken the rest of the week to recover from all the travel. I will be in the clinic tomorrow, ready or not! Thank you for praying as I make the adjustments back to ministry in Haiti.
