I have enjoyed catching up with long-time friends, meeting new people, and seeing how God has worked in the church families through the years. Some of the sweetest words have been, "I pray for you regularly," and, "I've prayed for you every day for years." Our Heavenly Father knows the results of all those prayers.

Praise God gave safe travels driving a moving van (twice!).

I was glad to have some time back home to take care of multiple appointments and to complete the schedule for the coming months. Time at home meant being available to help friends with medical questions and needs.

We were glad to hear of the safe arrival of medications in Haiti at the intended destination. I hear of patients there buying meds that don't work, often at high prices.

Prayer As God wills, I would like safe travels during the coming months. It is already clear there will be some changes in routes due to the effects of the severe storm that went through the western Carolinas at the end of September

My Haitian staff members continue to trust in God for their needs and safety. Both are becoming more difficult with food shortages, continually rising prices, and the movement of gangs out of Portau-Prince.
