Livingston—Thoughts and Updates 8 July 2017

As I read about the lives of Jeremiah and Ezekiel recently, I was impressed with their devotion to God, and their willingness to obey in the area of marriage.

Jeremiah received a command to remain single (Jeremiah 16:1-4). Was there someone he hoped to marry? Was there a yielding to God's will on the part of two people? Many single Christian friends have talked about being given a choice between marriage or following God's will. For some of us, a reason for singleness was revealed later on, although God probably has many reasons for each of His plans. Jeremiah was surely grateful when in hiding or in prison that he did not have a family suffering as well. But the overarching reason for such a command may be testing our love and our obedience to God.

We do not know the name of Ezekiel's wife (Ezekiel 24:16,18), but we know she was the "desire" of his eyes. She was probably his companion during the months of street theater, his encourager in the face of the Jews' unbelief, his faithful partner during the years when the only time he spoke was to give the word of God. And in one day she was gone. There are many faithful people like this woman. No one knows their names or remembers anything they did. We have probably all felt that unimportant at one time or another. But Ezekiel's precious wife represented the temple, God's dwelling place, the location dear to His heart. God knows our names and what we have done, just as He knows hers. And we are precious to Him.

These were people who heard God's word, trusted Him, and obeyed when it might not have been easy. They

have been examples and blessings to me.
