It is so easy to take our cars for granted. We get in, turn the key, and off we go. I was traveling in West Virginia at the end of October, and remembered the challenges of the roads there. One section on the interstate had an 8% downhill grade for three miles, followed by several miles of a twisting, two lane road around a mountain. I returned to Greenville, South Carolina without problems the following Monday. And then on Thursday, I stepped on the brake—and it went to the floor. There were many reasons to praise God. I was in home territory with friends to help, on a fairly level surface at a slow speed, with a safe place to park and a mechanic nearby who was familiar with the vehicle. And, yes, I did praise God for His goodness.

Much has happened since I returned from Haiti on September 22. My worker Isaac came with me, and he was able to see many of his American friends in South Carolina and Indiana before his return to Haiti in October. I worked on a new presentation, and it was ready for my report to the committee of Baptist World Missions at the Annual meeting in Indianapolis in mid-October. I visited churches in Indiana, West Virginia, and North and South Carolina, driving more than 5000 miles. Thank you for praying for my safety on the roads.

**Praise** The rest of the batteries for the Ministry Residence solar system went to Wallondri the day I returned to the USA.

There have been special opportunities to talk to children and young people as well as adults. I was able to give medical advice to some missionaries during the BWM conference.

**Projects** We are building on farm land rather than bed rock this time, and it is clear that we need sidewalks between the buildings. God has provided the funds.

I am still asking God to provide two electricians, a plumber and a general construction person. The clinic and I can move into the Ministry Residence once we have water and electricity. If you are interested, please send me a note at fannelivingston@gmail.com.
