We need electrical and plumbing work done, along with painting and the possible building of cabinets. My supporting churches have already received a letter about possible teams to do the work.

Prayer I plan to **return to Haiti on January 13**. There is usually a list of things that need to be done, and I have already heard of patients who are waiting for me.

Two student nurses are planning to come for several weeks this coming summer. Please pray that these young women will have God's direction and provision.

We follow sport teams, admire celebrities and are awed by politicians. But no team has an all-win, noloss record. Today's celebrities are tomorrow's has-beens. The current power-brokers will soon be impotent. And they will all eventually die, most without ever taking notice of us. Those of us who have been transformed by God's grace through faith in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ have the amazing privilege to consciously live in the presence of the almighty, all-knowing God Who cares for us and about us. *Coram Deo* would be an excellent Guide for 2015.
