Dear Praying Friends:

The past three months have had surprises, schedule changes and unanticipated expenses. Many of you already know about my unexpected surgeries for cataracts. That made for some interesting changes in plans, both for me and for the people who graciously did the necessary driving. Those surgeries were not in my budget, but God provided for my part of the costs and for new glasses. Only one meeting was cancelled, and that was because of predicted icy roads that would have made church services impossible. I am writing this letter on the day I had planned to travel from Lansing, Michigan, to Greenville, South Carolina, but am delaying a day because of poor road conditions over most of the route due to a winter storm. There is so much that happens in our lives every day over which we have no control—but God does. We have such security knowing we are safe in Him.

My current plans are to drive overnight to Fort Pierce, Florida, unload the boxes and luggage, make some last minute purchases, and then rest. I will return to Haiti on January 10, our Lord willing.

Dr. Bud Steadman, the executive director of Baptist World Mission, and his wife Ruth will be in Haiti during January. They plan to visit me in Wallondri January 16-21. Please pray that they will have safety in travel, and for my worker Isaac as he does the driving. My fellow missionaries and I hope to give the Steadmans a good idea of the various ministries in our area.

I want to work on more reliable sources for purchasing medications in Haiti in the coming months. Some of what we use is becoming very expensive or difficult to purchase in the United States. The past year, our supplier in Cap Haitien frequently was out of what we ordered. My hope is to find medications that are good quality, reasonably priced and readily available.
